

*Excess revenue over expenses includes endowment fund contributions of \$1,657,661 and endowment income of \$1,215,902 (dividends, interest, and net realized and unrealized gains) of which \$249,515 was available for operations. Excluding endowment fund contributions and endowment fund income, net of \$249,515 transferred in for operations, The Caltech Y operating fund incurred a surplus of \$74,341 during the fiscal year ending September 30, 2021.



Giving to the Caltech Y

When you make a gift to the Caltech Y, you may choose how the funds will be used as you consider the options for making your donation. Unrestricted gifts allow the Caltech Y to allocate funds wherever the need is greatest, which means that your gift may be used across the entire spectrum of Caltech Y programs. Directed gifts allow you to choose the Caltech Y area of interest that most suits your intention. All donations are tax deductible.

Here are options to consider when making your Unrestricted or Directed gift:

The Caltech Y Centennial Endowment:

A strong financial base guarantees that future generations of students will benefit from the Caltech Y's programs. Consider adding to an existing fund or establish a new named fund. Whatever method you choose, giving to the endowment fund creates a permanent legacy of support for the Caltech Y for generations to come.

Charitable Gifts from IRAs:

You may roll over your IRA to the Caltech Y and exclude the entire amount of that gift from your taxable income (certain limits apply). You can also create a charitable remainder trust as the beneficiary of your IRA, so that your heirs receive income from the trust and the Caltech Y receives any remaining principal.

Cash Gifts:

With a minimum gift of \$200 per person, or \$400 per couple, become a Friend of the Caltech Y and attend invitation-only special dinners and events.

United Way Pledges:

Caltech staff and faculty may contribute through the United Way Campaign, which usually runs in the fall. If you are a Caltech employee, you can designate the Caltech Y to receive your pledge and the Institute match. Other companies also offer United Way matching. Please inquire at your workplace.

Securities, Stocks, and Bond:

These can provide a considerable tax advantage if transferred to the Caltech Y before they are sold.

Planned Gifts:

Bequest life-income plans and estate gifts are effective and taxefficient ways to make a legacy gift to the Caltech Y.

Matching Gifts:

Many companies offer matching gift benefits to their employees, doubling the value of their charitable contributions. Check with your company's human resources or benefits office to see if your employer has a corporate matching gift program. Your support will go twice as far.

Ways to contribute with everyday shopping:

AmazonSmile:

You can support the Caltech Y while you do your day-to-day or holiday shopping. When you shop at AmazonSmile, Amazon donates 0.5% of the purchase price to the Caltech Y. You can designate the Caltech Y as your charitable organization of choice. Bookmark the link http://smile.amazon.com and support the Y every time you shop.

Ralphs Community Rewards Program:

If you have a Ralphs Rewards card, you can support us while you shop at Ralphs. Once you register your card online, you can choose the Caltech Y as your preferred charitable organization. Simply visit www.ralphs.com to set up your Ralphs account. Once logged in, search for CALTECH Y (nonprofit number TG312), and then click Enroll. Swipe your registered Ralphs Rewards card or use the associated phone number when shopping.
